Supporting your child at home with...spelling

There are many methods to use at home: the basic strategies of 'sounding out' using phonics and look, cover, write, check - work for many learners. However, you may also wish to try some of these approaches:

- For tricky words, think about shape and size of the word.
- Break words into syllables, e.g. re-mem-ber.
- Use a mnemonic, e.g. necessary: one collar; two sleeves.
- Say words as they sound/in a funny way, e.g. Wed-nes-day.
- Encourage the children to find words within words, e.g. parliament: I AM parliament.
- Sing it!
